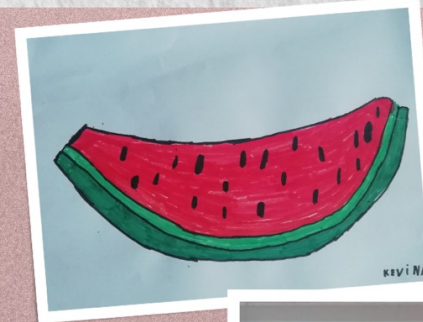

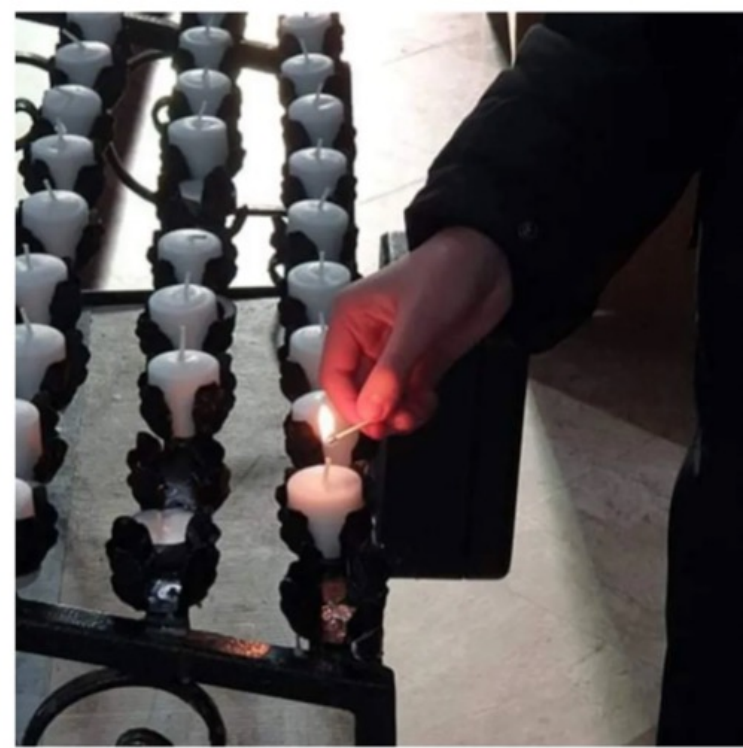

Once my project was approved, I got to work. I spent some time making a poster for the school main entrance, and I purchased a basket to collect the bracelets. After the poster was done, I started spreading the word around the school. I worked hard on making perfect announcements for the daily bulletin that was broadcast over the loudspeaker. I got the message out on Google classroom as well.

So far my middle school has made 121 bracelets, and more to come. The bracelets will show the Ukrainian children they are not forgotten and that people in the USA care about them.
